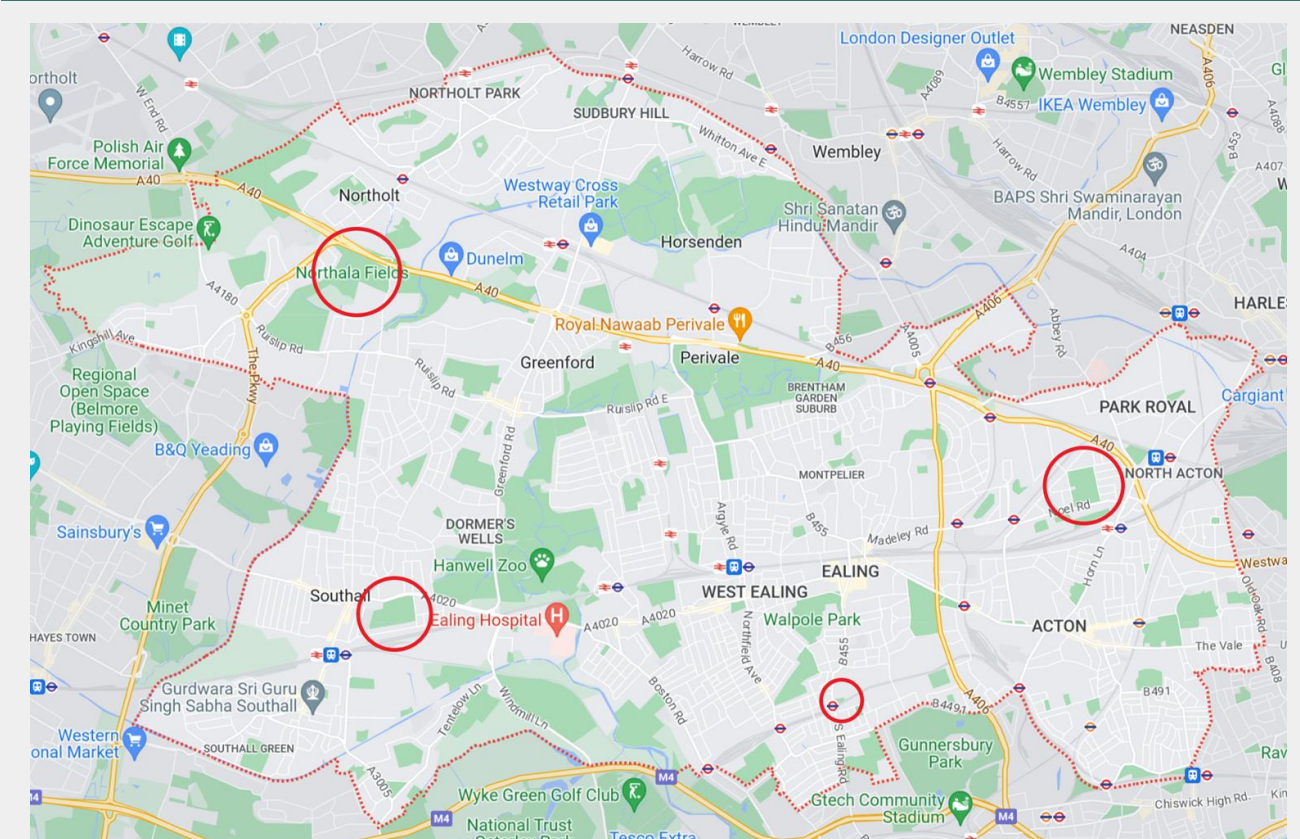

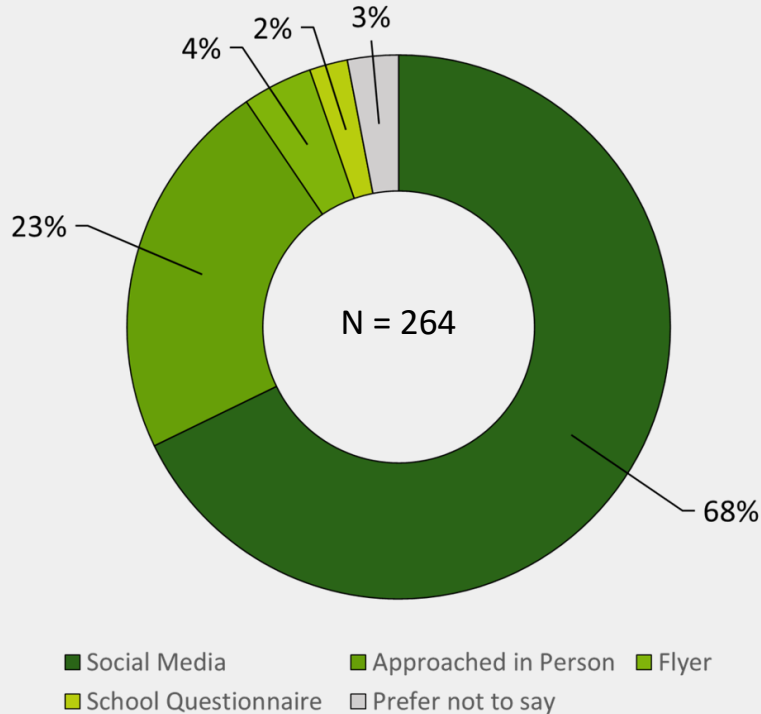


## Map of Parks Surveyed

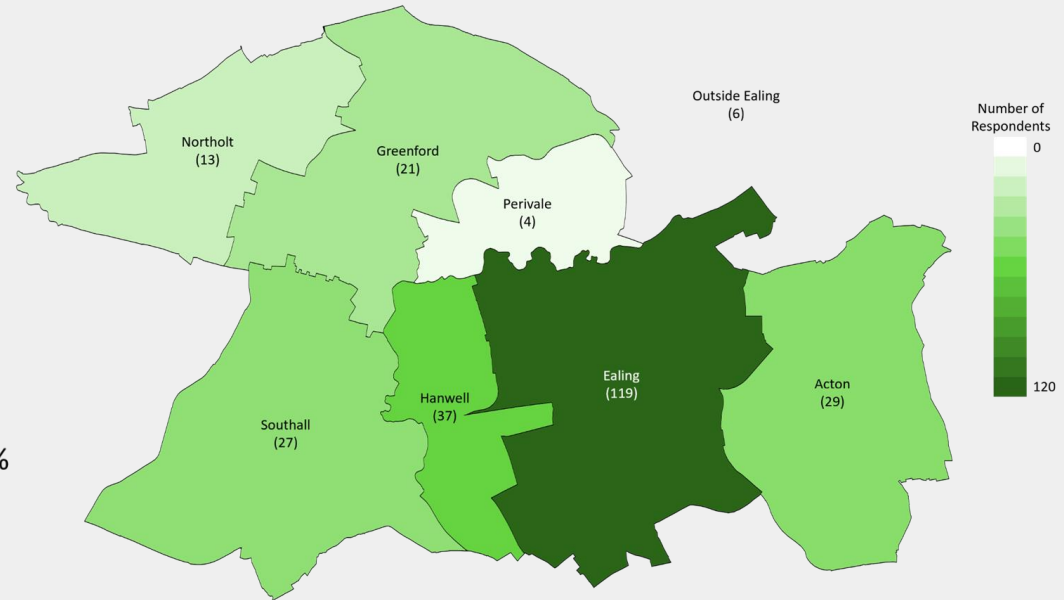

## Access Method of Survey Respondents



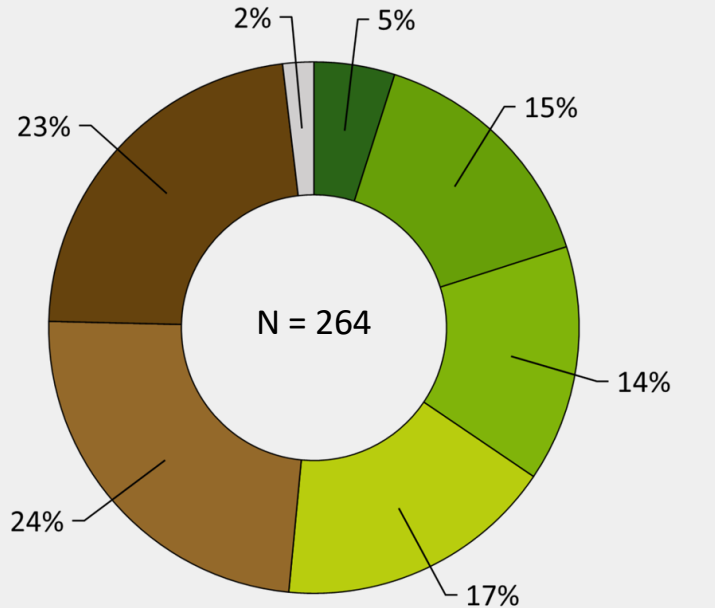
## Geographic Distribution of Survey Respondents





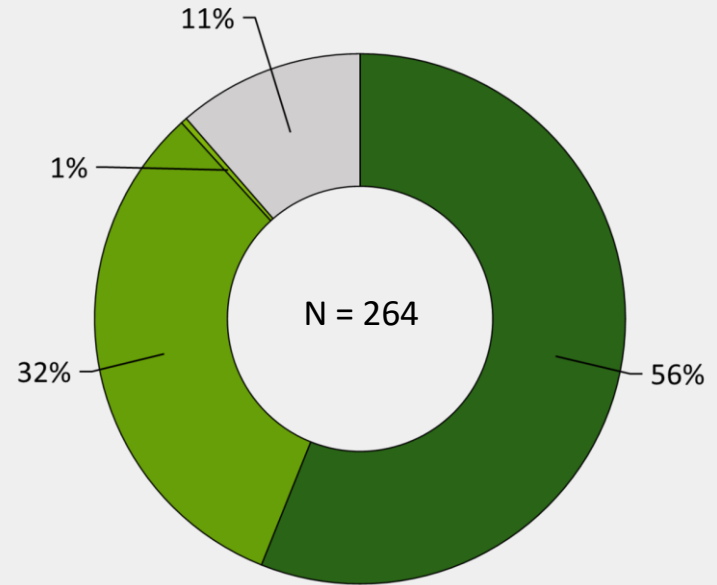

Age of Survey Respondents



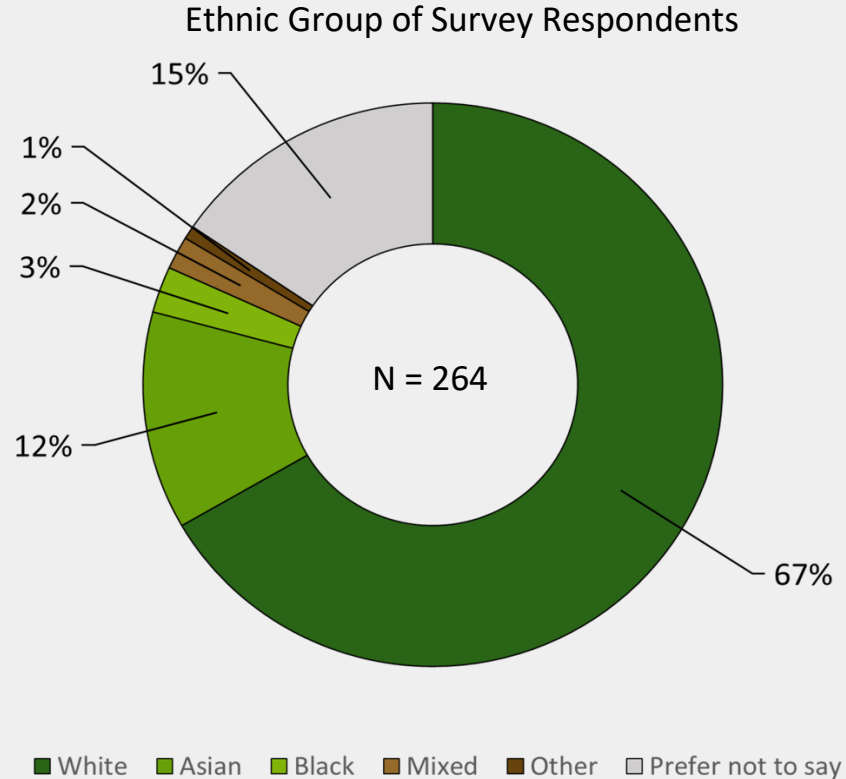
■ 18-24 years ■ 25-34 years ■ 35-44 years ■ 45-54 years

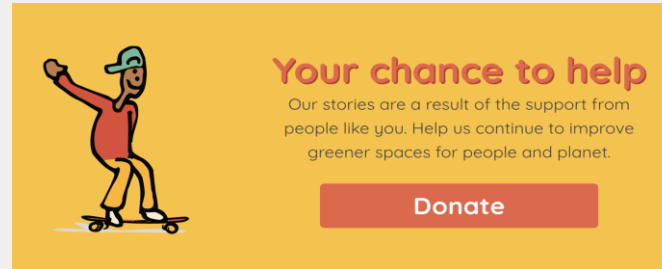

## Antisocial Behavior

- Vandalism, drug and alcohol use, rough sleeping

## Lack of Certain Features

- Lighting
- Toilets

## Other Factors

- Dogs
- Weather
- Litter

“The park is not well lit and has no gates in the winter, there are groups of youths hanging around, there is low level drug dealing, and various ‘odd’ people standing around, so I don’t use the park when it is dark early.”

“Dogs off leads are the absolute, leading factor. I would much prefer those with dogs to have an area fenced off for them to go.”

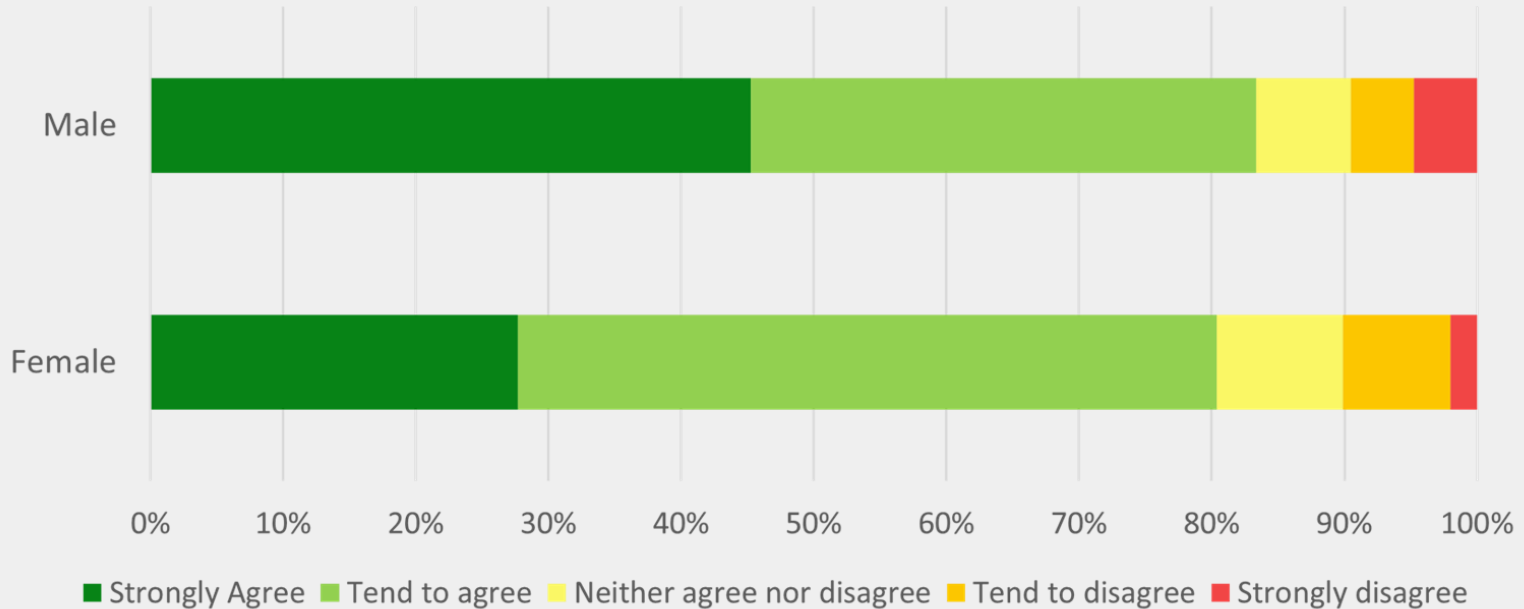
“Less enjoyable in the colder weather.”

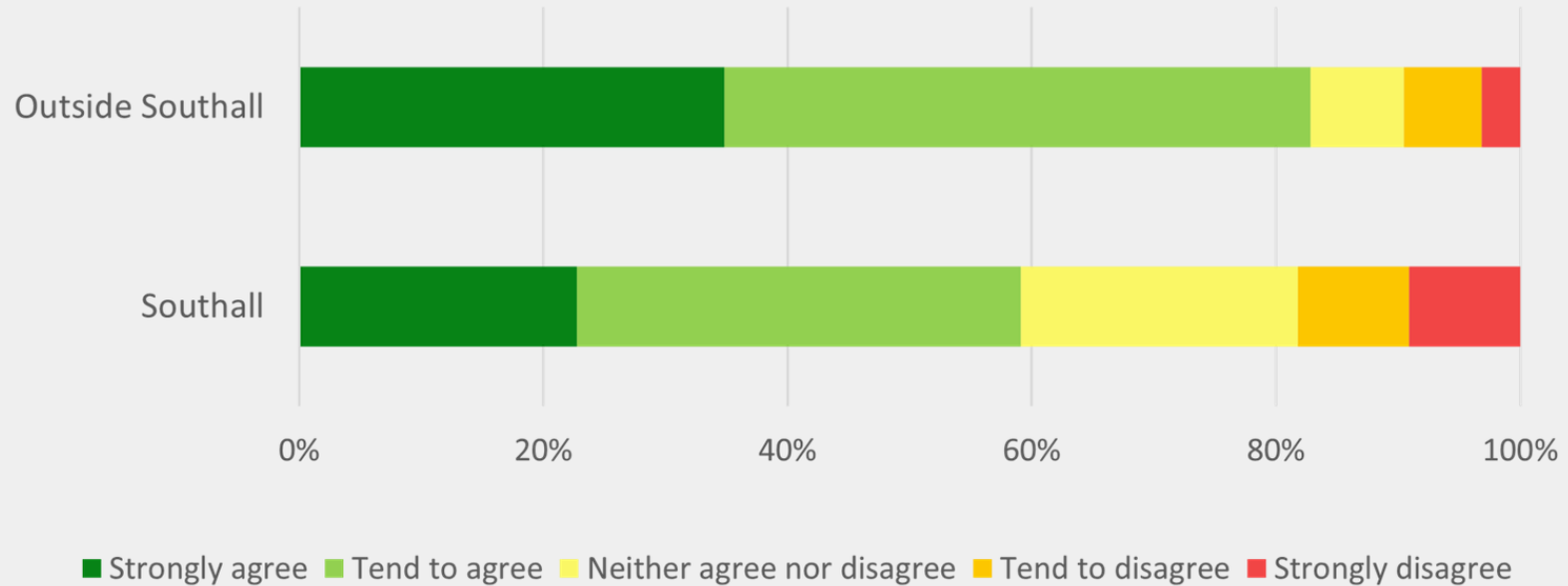
Agreement with Statement: "I feel safe in parks in the borough."





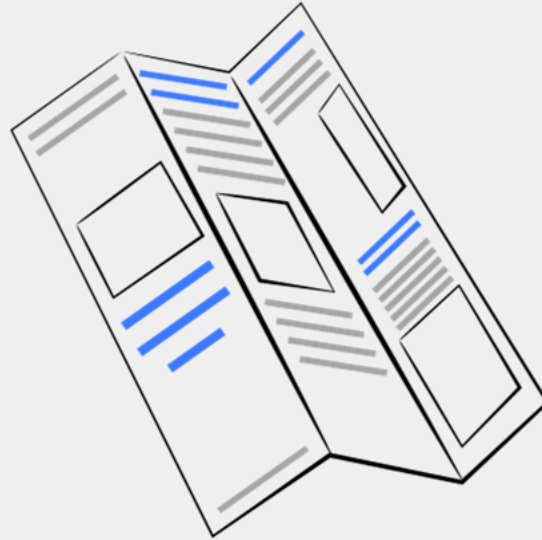

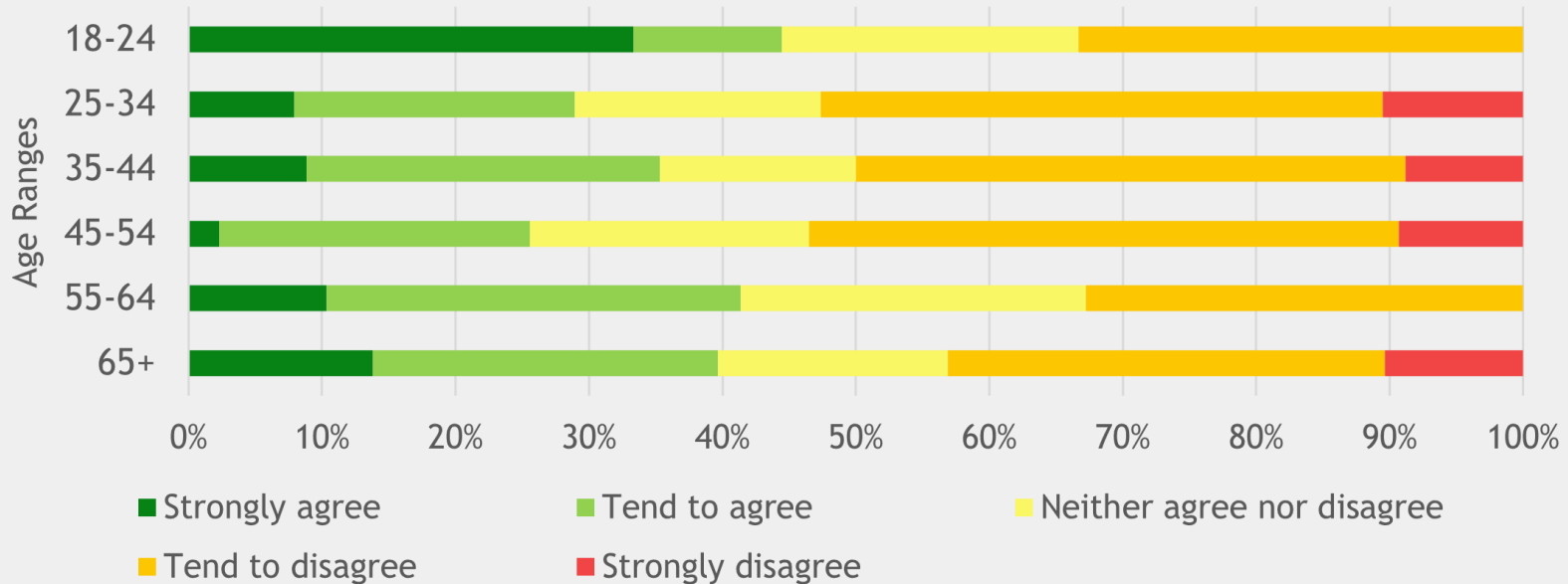


## Access to Toilets



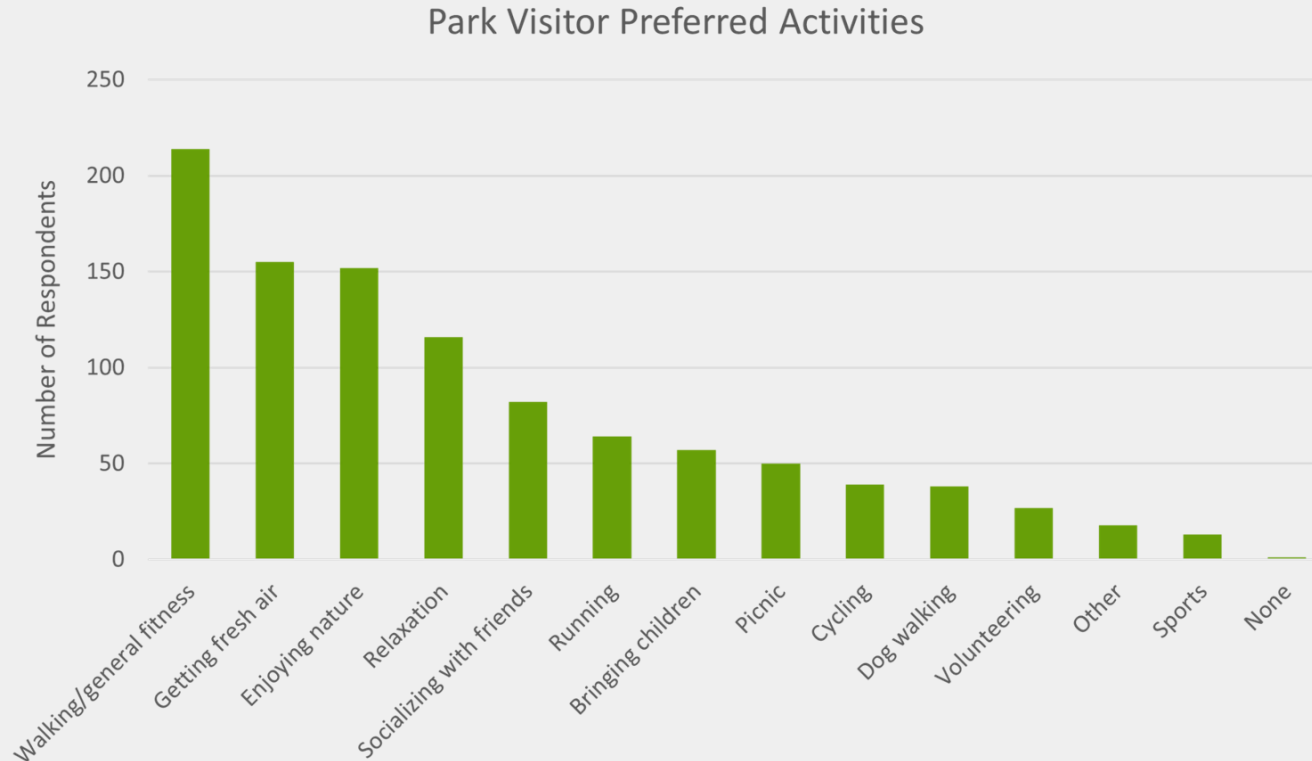

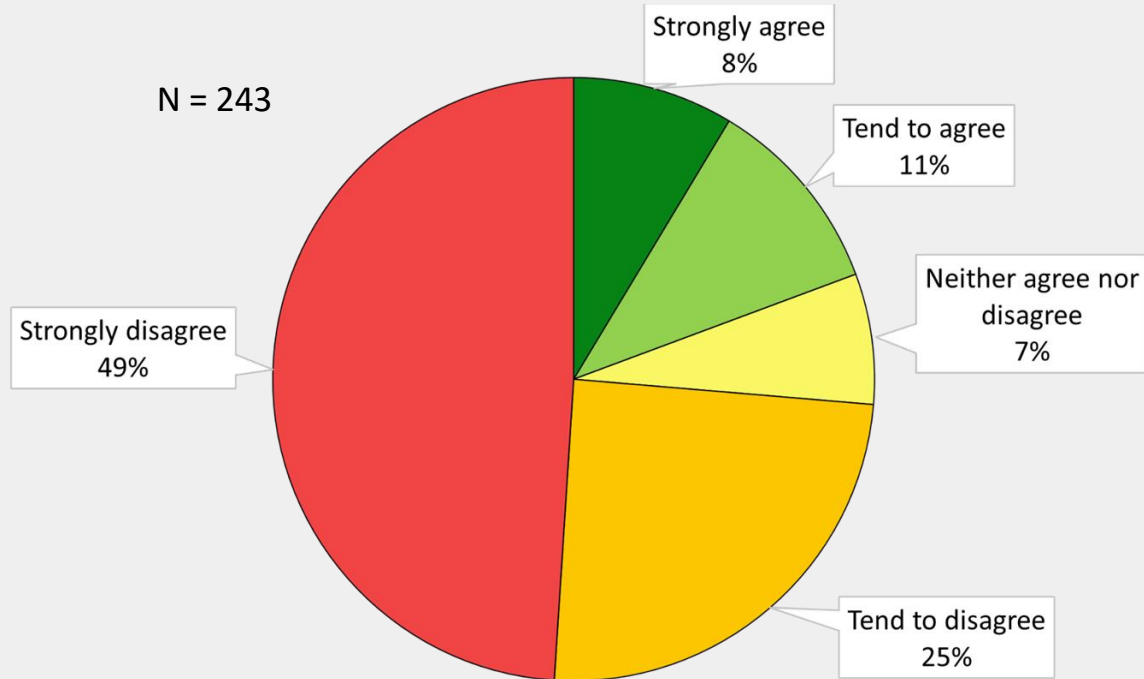


There is the potential for the Ealing Parks Foundation to be a central body for facilitating communication between parks-related groups.

# Recommendations

## Enhancing Fundraising Efforts

# Recommendations

## Addressing Safety Concerns

- Certain features can increase the perception of park safety
- Reducing antisocial behavior

## Meeting Community Needs

- Continued improvements of park facilities is necessary
- Identify specific parks and sites for future projects



# Considerations for Future Research

## Reaching Park Non-Users

- Identifying regions of low park usage
- Developing strong knowledge base on communities across the borough

## Survey Distribution Methods

- Finding specific leaders to reach out to
- Addressing language barriers
- Greater consideration of digital exclusion

## Observational Data Collection


- Develop a standardized tool
