Sorters, Recorders, Weighers, Cleaners, etc.




8 categories and 18 sub-categories

Arrive at 7, work till 3:30






## Materials Recovery Facility

Requires items to be sorted into plastics, tin/aluminum, glass, corrugated cardboard and Household waste.



### **Commercial Hauler**

Requires items to be sorted into plastics and tin/aluminum recyclables, Glass, and Household Waste.



### The action phase was an unforgettable experience.


















### The Nantucket waste system is complex.





#### **Bulky Items**

Items such as appliances, mattresses, smoke detectors, and alkaline batteries can be disposed of at the landfill.



#### Hazardous Waste

There are six (6) Household & Commercial Hazardous Waste collection events per year. Items that may be collected during these events include:


