- PFAS stands for Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances
- PFAS are chemicals commonly used in manufacturing and everyday consumer products

Everyday Products that may contain PFAS

- Fire fighting foam
- Non-stick cookware
- Cleaning products
- Textiles and carpet
- Clothing
- Cosmetics

Associated Health Impacts

- High blood pressure
- High cholesterol
- Altered liver function
- Reproductive problems
- decreased vaccine effectiveness
- Kidney and testicular cancer

Environmental Impacts

- PFAS is know to be contributor of climate change
- PFAS contaminates ground water and surface water
- Contaminated water ends up in drinking water supplies and in

animal environments harming exposed ecosystems

Regulations
